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Bullying as a group behaviour





- The ringleader ('Bully') Initiating and leading the bullying but not always the person 'doing' the bullying.
- The target The person at whom the bullying is aimed.
- Assistant(s) Actively involved in 'doing' the bullying.
- Reinforcer(s) Supports the bullying, might laugh or encourage other people to 'collude'
- Defender(s) Stands up for someone being bullied. Knows that bullying is wrong and feels confident enough to do something about it. This might involve talking to an adult.
- Outsider/Bystander(s) Ignores any bullying and doesn't want to get involved.

Aims

"Cyber" (online) bullying

- Definition: The use of digital technology to deliberately and repeatedly harm, harass, or intimidate others.
- Common platforms: social media (Instagram, TikTok, Snapchat), messaging apps (WhatsApp, Discord), online games, and even group chats.
- Examples:
 - Sending or sharing hurtful messages or images
 - Posting rumours or embarrassing content online
 - Impersonating someone online to damage their reputation
 - Excluding others from online groups or chats

Possible Symptoms


- Withdrawn (or obsessive) on devices?


